You must call the **College Board at (866) 756-7346** to request this change. When you call, please have your Admission Ticket with you, and please ask them to waive the \$28 change fee. Because Beverly Hills HS was not available as a test center at the time that you registered, you should be entitled to a free test center change. Do not make the change online. **Please call ASAP as space on our campus is limited.**
