- You must have your permit visible and posted in the REAR VIEW mirror (not flipped over nor behind another permit)

**COLLEGE VISIT ATTENDANCE POLICY:** Students missing school to visit colleges **MUST** complete and submit the required **'Future Absence Request'**. **NEW – PAID SUMMER INTERNSHIPS AT THE HILTON!** If you are responsible, enthusiastic, mature, and ready to be an important BHHS ambassador as one of our first Hilton Interns, see below for the position descriptions and application process. - **Pastry-**

They would shadow our bakers, cooks, and pastry specialist as they create various orders for upscale events, amenities, and daily consumption for our hotel guests. The ideal candidate would currently be enrolled in the school's culinary program.
- **Housekeeping –**  
The Intern will shadow Managers and assist with any administrative task in the office. This may include assisting with VIP room inspections, learning daily room assignments, payroll, inventory, checking rooms for front office and other managerial duties as assigned.  
The ideal candidate would have to be interested in the hospitality industry and learning back of the house management responsibilities.
- **Information Technology –**  
The Intern will work directly with our IT director and assist with various projects such as updating systems, installing new software, inventory, and other projects as assigned.  
The ideal candidate would have some IT background.
