After doing those two steps, applicants will be contacted by Pacific Pier if they are selected for an interview; and, since there are logistics issues for students working at Pacific Park (hours, transportation, etc.), we will be having a mandatory student/parent information session for students selected for an interview so the Pacific Park Human Resources Recruiter can come explain everything to make sure the expectations are clear to everyone.
