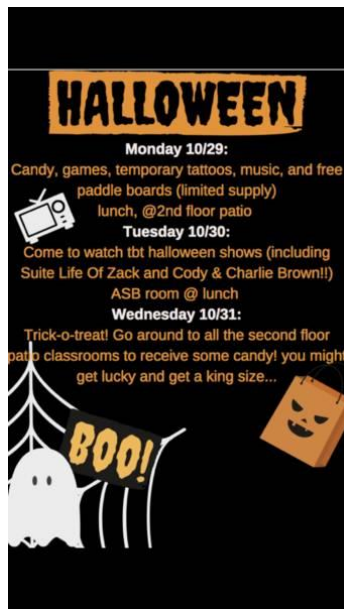

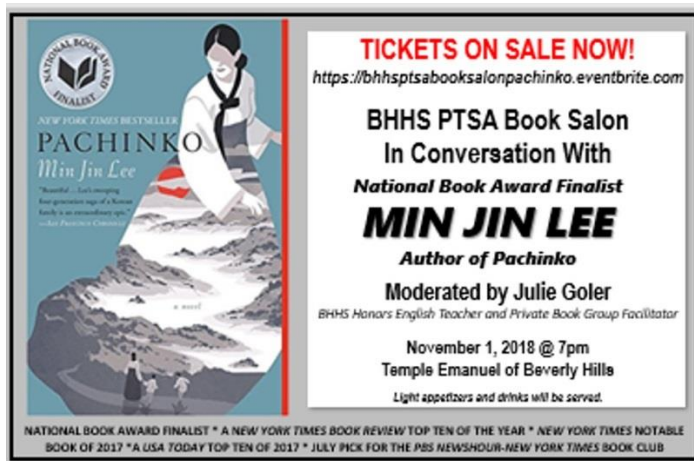

College Tour November 8, 2018 (for 11th graders only) Juniors, are you interested in attending a **one-day college tour to visit University of California, Los Angeles and Loyola Marymount University**? The College Center will be taking up to 45 students for a one-day two campus college tour, lunch included on **November 8, 2018**. Spaces will fill on a first-come first-serve basis, incomplete applications will not be accepted. Here's how to grab your spot to meet with admissions, tour the campuses and explore two local universities! Complete and turn the Fall 2018 College Tour Application and **turn into the College Center by October 29, 2018**. Once you hand in your application you will receive **permission slips to be completed and turned in by November 2, 2018**. Incomplete or late permission slips will not be accepted. Requesting Letters of Recommendation & Transcripts, Deadlines/Important Information:

Seniors, it is your responsibility to request your letters of recommendation and any supplemental materials required for your applications appropriately and on time. Please see guidelines below and ensure that steps are complete. We encourage you to complete your Senior meeting with your counselor and continue attending college center events for further support.

- **Letters of Recommendation:** Request letters of recommendation from your teachers and counselor **by October 1st for Early Applications and November 1st for Regular Applications**. Request by asking in person and completing the Brag Sheet in Naviance for Counselors and any Teachers that ask for it. **Ensure to continue requesting through the .org email**. Officially request your recommenders directly through your applications and continue communicating with your recommenders throughout the process. <http://tinyurl.com/bhhsnaviance>
- **Transcripts:** Request your official transcript to go to your Common App, private/out-of-state and any colleges needing an official transcript initially through **Parchment**. Create a Parchment account at <https://www.parchment.com/u/registration/5653/account> and see Ms. Bennett with any questions in Rm. 263.
- **SAT/ACT Scores:** Officially request SAT/ACT scores to go to campuses requiring official scores. Students need to request officially on their Collegeboard or ACT account. If you have qualified for SAT/ACT fee waivers, you may get fees waived. Please note: Some colleges will allow you to self-report, so do read carefully what is required!

Volunteer Opportunity: The First Serenity Hospice in Century City has volunteer service opportunities for students 16 years and over, in an office/administrative support capacity. They require three (3) volunteer hours minimum per week with a six (6) month volunteer commitment required. If selected, students will be required to attend an orientation with a volunteer coordinator, have a TB test unless their position will be strictly administrative work. The position will provide an opportunity for gaining insight toward various professions and the potential to validate a career interest as well as exposure to working with a local hospice team including: hospice nurses, spiritual counselor, and social worker.
