CSF Eligible Students If you received a letter informing you that you qualify for membership in the California Scholarship Federation (CSF), please be sure to **pay your membership dues by February 23, 2018**. CSF members are eligible for special awards upon graduation. Four semesters as a CSF member (grades 10 -12 with one semester in the senior year) result in a Lifetime Member certificate, gold cord, and a CSF pin.

CSF membership is not automatic, even if you are eligible. You must sign up and pay a \$6.00 membership fee each semester in which you qualify. An additional \$5.00 penalty will be added for all late payments, however, this will ensure that you receive the recognition you deserve at graduation.
