No Student Parking Note for Wednesday, March 14: Please note that in order to make room for our 100 visiting speakers participating on Wednesday, March  $14^{th}$ , we will be closing the student parking lot and will require students to park off campus. As in the past, we have worked with the BHPD which has indicated that relaxed enforcement will be in effect that day from 6:30 am -5 pm and no tickets will be given for students parking in otherwise limited hour parking or street cleaning areas. Citations will still be given for safety reasons so students should NOT block driveways, park in red zones or near fire hydrants or they will be ticketed. A detailed Jupiter message will be sent to families Monday as another reminder.
